Ah I used to love telling the time with Trip to Trumpton .. anyway, a great saying that works well for us now, anecdotal chats have revealed that the new 30 mph limit has not only improved the speed of traffic on the old stretch of road out of the village but has noticeably improved speeds in the middle of the village. It certainly seems a lot quieter and calmer a lot of the time. A good result and we may be the envy of other nearby villages, but you didn't hear that from me!



The local constabulary, not quite at the Trabant stage yet despite cuts, have been very active on the enforcement front, 26 tickets issued in one stint apparently. That's a very clear message!

The work must not stop there though so we continue to press highways for further interventions to design out the speed in the village

and make it a more pleasant place. We still had 99,000 vehicle movements one way between mid-December and mid-March and significant speeding is still an issue, one Speedy Gonzalez topped 70mph which is wholly unacceptable.

On that note we have been successful in securing a meeting with the Head of Highways at the County Council and we will report back with news following this.
